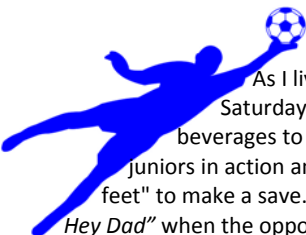
Ryan Love's consistent whinging must also be noted after last weeks Mini World Cup. A man with that many tattoo's should not be carrying on that way should he?

As I live on the Gold Coast it makes sense to go and watch local teams play on a Saturday morning. I grab my fold out chair, bribe my son with offers of food and beverages to get him to come along and off we go. As a result, I get to see a lot of juniors in action and an area of the goalkeepers game that pops up a lot is "staying on your feet" to make a save. My son has got to the stage of saying, " *he should of 'stayed on his feet' Hey Dad*" when the opposition score. Common sense suggests that of course, but in a game when the pressure is on players are inclined to go back to habits learned in training. How do we fix it you ask,? Oh you didn't ask..... Well, I'm going to tell you anyway. React only to what you see and don't anticipate. Once you see the ball leave the attacking players boot then move, not before. If you anticipate where the ball is going then that usually leads to going to ground early and unless they knock it into your hands a goal is the result. Have a think next time in training or in a game about this little tip and see if you can resist the temptation to go down too early. Best of luck and "keep working hard"

Premier Youth

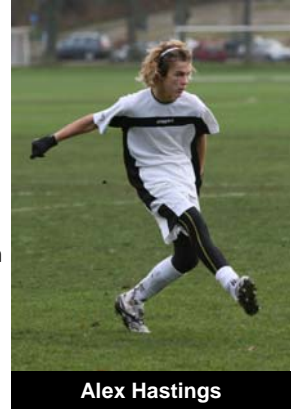

Have you ever heard of a Banding Rule in our local game? Let me explain. Last year Football Brisbane introduced what is called a “Banding Rule”. This is supposedly to stop clubs “Stacking” teams. How it works is as follows (*using this club as an example*).

Premier Band: Each club in the Premier League **MUST** name 22 players who **CAN ONLY** play Premier League or Reserves.

Under 21 Band: Each Club in Under 21's **MUST** name 11 players who can only play Under 21's or above.

Youth 1 Band: Each Club with a Premier Youth Team **MUST** name 11 players who can only play Premier Youth or above.

Youth 2 Band: Each Club with a second Youth side can register as many as they want but players can only play in this band or above.

The Pecking Order is as Follows

1. Premier Band
2. Under 21 Band
3. Youth 1 Band
4. Youth 2 Band

Once a player has played above his Band 6 times he must stay up. This means if a club has injuries or suspension they must be careful how many times they use a player up as when the injured player comes back, they will have no place to play. This is something we have to juggle week in and week out when we are selecting squads. It leaves us no room to give young players too much experience in the higher age groups.

So much for player development. Unfortunately it is clubs who continue to do the right thing that get punished, because a few clubs continue to do the wrong thing....
