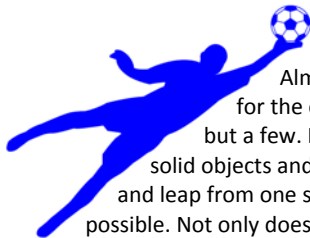

## **KEEPER TIPS   KEEPER TIPS   KEEPER TIPS**

Almost every session, I bring out the dreaded elastic from my bag and wait for the complaints. How many sets? That's too high, I need a stretch, to name but a few. I pull the elastic to about 6 or 7 metres in length and attach the ends to solid objects and adjust a height. Sets of 3 to 5 and reps of 10 to 20 depending how high and leap from one side to the other with the least amount of contact time on the ground as possible. Not only does this exercise improve (fast twitch) explosive power but it helps in developing lower body strength as well, not to mention the great aerobic conditioning effect. To give an example one 13 year old after 12 months of " Plyometric" work has a vertical leap of 56cm. This equates to a fantastic horizontal leap enabling the athlete to pull out those amazing saves we sometimes see. Set the height low to start with and once your keepers are more accomplished make it higher. I hope it works as well for you as it does me, remember to "keep working hard" and I will see you next time.

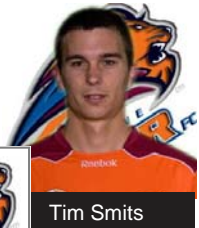

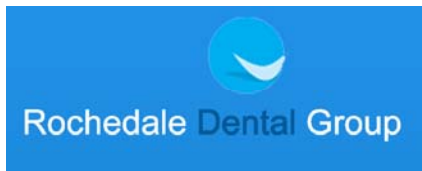

# “The Clubman”

**I** class myself in football terms as "Old School" and so does Coops and probably most of the other Coaches around the place.

"Old School" football people tend to reflect on what the game was like in "our" day and "our" day quite often comes out on top when comparisons are made with today's game. Obviously that has nothing to do with bias or fading memories - it's just that we can't be wrong!

One of the things that gets frequently talked about is the amount of free kicks and yellow and red cards that are handed out for tackles where the tackler goes to ground and the sole of his boot can be seen as he makes the tackle.



Now, I openly admit that I have been free with my "Old School" views and opinions on this topic and have openly said that officials are turning the game soft and are wiping the hard men from the game. However, I have to now admit that after seeing some horrendous challenges on TV that have resulted in horrific injuries putting talented players out of the game for long periods and on occasions permanently, my view is changing.

The tackling in the recent Merseyside Derby was a disgrace and a really bad advert for the game and it is probably only someone with a thugs mentality who prefers to see that kind of stuff over moments of skill.



Recent highly publicised bad tackles and subsequent horrific injuries to Aaron Ramsey and Eduardo from Arsenal may have highlighted just how bad the tackling techniques of some current players are.

Players and their Managers are always quick to jump in and offer the defense that no malice was intended and that the tackle was mistimed or poorly executed. (Roy Keane being the ex-

*ception when he freely admitted planning for a long period to maim an opponent who had belittled him)*

Those sort of comments have made me put my "old school" values aside and admit there are a lot of players out there with very poor tackling techniques and they are very capable of causing extreme damage.

If the officials can cause our players to review and modify their poor techniques through their strict policing then I say more power to them. There you go a first - me agreeing with officials.

Officials will still give free kicks and hand out cards that we think are wrong and soft, but their mistakes will not cause broken legs.



Injuries are part and parcel of the game and just last week I was still being "old school" and paying out (quietly) on officials for being soft, but after seeing 19 year old Aaron Ramsey having his career put on hold or maybe even ended by a poorly executed tackle I have changed my view and I am sure that some other members of the "Old School" club who have kids playing the game will have too.

What is the importance of players looking the part? Some people and some clubs don't worry too much about things like this and I suppose at the end of the day it's not going to get you Three Points. Or is it? I personally am a big believer in players looking the part - players being organized, players being prepared to play.

The preparation should start from home, probably the night before a game. *"Do I have my boots? Are they clean? Do I have both molded and screw ins? Do I have my shin pads, warm up shirt, etc., etc. Do I have everything I need to play and do I have everything I need that I was told to bring?"* This might sound a bit silly for some of you reading this, but to me being prepared shows professionalism, attitude and organization. It shows me players are thinking of the game well before they arrive in the dressing rooms.

How many times have you seen or heard *"I forgot my shin pads"* or *"Oh, I couldn't find my warm up shirt"*. This just shows me that these players are not focused and have left everything until the last minute. For me there is just no acceptable excuse.

The same can be said for players arriving late at a game. To me there is no excuse. If a player is serious, and is concentrating on the game then he will always leave enough time for problems, i.e. traffic, inclement weather, etc., etc.

This all may seem a bit strange for some of you to understand the importance of acting and dressing the part, but believe me it works. This is an area (particularly in Juniors) where we can help with the players development. If kids today start to take more responsibility when it comes to things like the above it will hold them in good stead. Do yourself a favour - next time you go to a game have a look at how the opposition turns up and compare them to how your team has turned up. Now tell me which team looks the more organized.

Does all this work? Why not try it and find out!
