KEEPER TIPS KEEPER TIPS KEEPER TIPS

This area of a keepers game can be a little difficult to work on, that's because of the area needed and most important of all, the service. Junior sessions can be frustrating in that a ball has to be served by hand most of the time so keepers can at least have a chance of coming out and catching the ball. There are not that many young keepers that can knock a ball in from say 20 odd metres out and of course everyone is at different ability levels. If you can take the first 2 or 3 crosses in a game cleanly and confidently it will have an impact on where the opposition deliver the ball. Having said that the key points I touch on are:

- 1) *Can the player on the ball score?* Ask yourself this question and step forward one pace off your line until you say; "*Yes he can score.*" Take half a step back and that is your start position.
- 2) Stand at an angle to see the ball and surrounding players.
- 3) Shoulder check and take a mental picture of players in your area before the ball is struck.
- 4) Hold and assess the ball flight.
- 5) Attack the ball.

There are other key coaching points on take off such as which knee to lift, where above your head to take the ball and so on, but for now have a think about these few tips. Remember to "keep working hard" and see you next time!

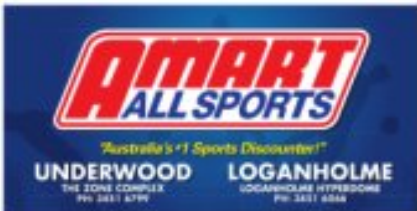
