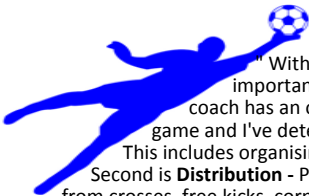

KEEPER TIPS KEEPER TIPS KEEPER TIPS



With so many areas to work on in a keepers game it's hard sometimes to know what the important things are. Of course every facet of a goalkeepers game is crucial and every coach has an opinion on this subject. From my point of view I look at what a keeper does in a game and I've determined the following key areas; Number 1 on my list is of course **Communication**. This includes organising defenders for corners, free kicks, to mark up, being encouraging and so forth. Second is **Distribution** - Playing out the back, throws, goal kicks, hand delivered strikes. Third is **High Balls** from crosses, free kicks, corners, balls over the top etc. Number 4 is **Shot Stopping**; saving goal bound attempts which would be shots, headers and so on. Fifth is **One on Ones**; self explanatory I think.

You might disagree with me on some of these areas but if you pay more attention next time you watch the seniors put it to the test. If you have any comments or questions I am only too happy to try and help, remember to "keep working hard" and I will see you next time.

With the World Cup not far away now we thought it might be interesting and a bit of fun to take a look at the groups. This week we'll take a look at groups A,B,C and D and next week cast an eye over groups E, F, G, and H.

GROUP A : South Africa, France, Uruguay, Mexico



France:- France despite having a squad containing some of the most gifted players in the game have really struggled recently to impress. Their Football has at times been boring and not what you would expect.

France had to rely on a William Gallas' extra time goal in a play off game against Ireland to reach the finals. Their main problem in their group games was their away form. On the road they suffered a 3-1 loss to Austria and could only squeeze out draws in Serbia and Romania. Despite their stuttering form will start favourites to top this group.

Players to watch:- Ribery and Henry.

Mexico:- Open up against the hosts and will be trying to reach quarter finals for first time since 1986. Mexico qualified for the finals by virtue of finishing second to U.S.A. in the Concacaf region. They have players playing in all the top leagues of Europe as well as at home and other parts of The Americas. This will be Mexico's fifth straight finals appearance so they know what it is about.



Players to watch:- Vela and Dos Santos



South Africa:- Lowest ranked team in the group, but a great performance at the Confederations Cup where they lost to Brazil in the semi final and narrowly to Spain in the third place play off game has raised confidence in the camp.

That performance has also raised the expectations of the home fans and those expectations along with the pressure of being the host nation is something that may really test them. A plus for South Africa is that in Carlos Alberto Parreira they have a coach experienced in World Cup finals football, with this being the fifth different team he has coached at this stage—having won with Brazil in 1994. **Players to watch:-** Pienaar and Makoena

GROUP B : Argentina, Nigeria, Korea Republic, Greece



Argentina:-Showed inconsistency in qualifying campaign. Their potential is vast with a squad full of stars. Maradonna, still a very inexperienced coach has the task of gelling this talent and has found it difficult so far.

No doubt that they have the players with the talent to go a long way but there are a lot of question marks. Will still be favourites in this group. **Players to watch**:-Messi and Tevez.

Korea Republic:-Dominant in their region and topped qualifying group. All action style and good technique could see them challenge for a top two spot in this group.

A repeat of 2002 heroics when they reached the semi final would appear beyond them.

Players to watch:-Park ji Sung and Park chu Young.

First appearance since debut in 1994 where they lost all three games. Experienced coach will send out a very competitive team. **Players to watch**:- Karagounis and Gekas



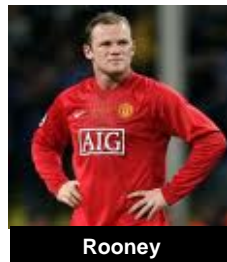
Fact:-*Maradonna's debut as a coach in the World Cup Finals will be against the last team he faced as a player in the World cup finals-Nigeria.*

Australia:-Have earned the right to bracketed with the best and have proved time and again that right is deserved. Have top performers plying their trade all over the world.



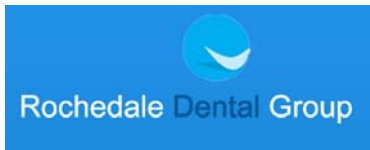
