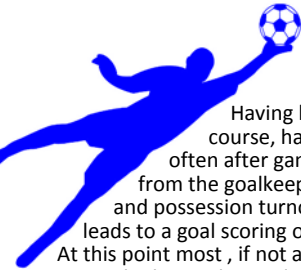

KEEPER TIPS KEEPER TIPS KEEPER TIPS

Having been involved with football over a number of years I find myself, unwittingly of course, having developed a certain amount of psychological skills. These are used most often after games when a post mortem takes place on individual . Performances especially from the goalkeeper. From a spectators point of view you watch a game and see many mistakes and possession turnovers and think nothing more of it until the keeper makes an error. This usually leads to a goal scoring opportunity and in most cases a goal so you can see where the mind games start. At this point most , if not all keepers, have a confidence issue and it takes many years to develop the skills to overlook mistakes and move on in a game. I work with all my goalkeepers to try and recognise where the error came from leading up to the goal and determine where we could of done better. Being a goalkeeper means you will concede goals no matter what level you play at and this is the nature of the beast. You have to learn to quickly move on and not dwell on it to much otherwise it will have a detrimental effect on your overall performance. Chin up, 'keep working hard' and I will see you next time. Congratulations go to **Milan Egic** from the Gold Coast who has made the Australian u13 team to play a tournament in Malaysia late May! He is a young goalkeeper to watch out for in the future and I am proud to have developed him over the last 3 years to get to this level.

Group H: Spain, Chile, Switzerland, Honduras

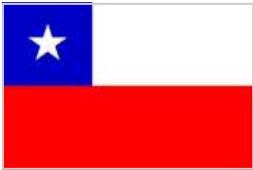

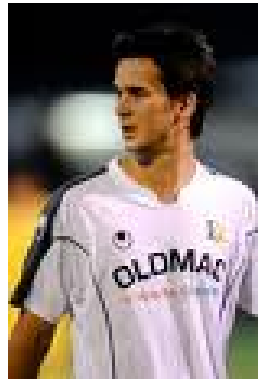
